- 0 **Exhibit Check-In:**
 - Monday, Aug. 21, 4:30-8:30 p.m.**
 - Tuesday, Aug. 22, 8:00 a.m.-Noon.**
 - 0 Must be this summer's produce and attractively displayed.
 - 0 If, in the opinion of the judges, a class does not have any entry worthy of a prize, none will be awarded. This means that an entry won't necessarily win first place simply because it is the only entry in that class. Judges' decisions are final.
 - 0 Exhibitors may have (1) entry per class.
 - 0 Sub-classes of general classes will be formed only if there are at least 3 entries which qualify for the new class.
 - 0 Cash premiums awarded by the Doddridge Co. Fair Association will be:
 - \$3.00 for First Place
 - \$2.00 for Second Place
 - \$1.00 for Third Place
