We hope you will consider a week of **Tri-County 4-H Camp** this summer. It's fun -- swimming, sports, bunk beds, games and new friends! We've been hosting 4-H camps for 90-years, so we have a proven record of excellence. Over 500 4-H'ers will be there this year and we hope **YOU** will be too!

Camp Frame is located three (3) miles west of Hedgesville, WV on State Route 9. The Camp is operated and maintained by the 4-H programs of Berkeley, Jefferson and Morgan Counties.

Please adjust your summer schedule to "stay in camp" full time. Attending a week of 4-H Camp is a great learning experience for a young person. The decision to attend 4-H camp should be carefully thought out and discussed between parents and 4-H'ers. You should commit for the full week; that means no signing out or leaving camp. If you cannot, you may need to reconsider 4-H camp this year. Campers are expected to remain at camp all week and attend closing council circle unless an emergency arises.

Tri-County Camp Dates and Age Divisions

The WVU Extension Service 4-H Camping program has strict guidelines for age divisions.

Attendees **MUST BE 9 years old** by October 1st 2019 and
MAY NOT BE older than 21 during the week of camp.

Older: June 10-14 - Ages 15 to 21 - No Late Registrations or Walk-Ins!

Intermediate: June 17-21 - Ages 12 to 14

Younger: June 23-27 (Sunday-Thursday) - Ages 8 to 11

ALL Participants who will be 18-21 years old as of the first day of Camp are required to complete additional paperwork and training including the following:

- Completion of Protecting our Children training through WVU with certificate on file
- Completed Harassment training through WVU with certificate on file
- Completed and cleared background check through WVU (19-21 year olds)

Camp registration is conducted on a first-come, first-served basis. Tri-County Camps will register no more than 175 campers per week. When the maximum number has registered for each camp, additional registrations cannot be accepted.

Reasonable Accommodations: If your child requires disability-related accommodations in order to participate in this 4-H camp or event, please contact Jill Hess, ADA Coordinator at 304-293-5600. A copy of your child's Individualized Education Plan (IEP), Section 504, or other appropriate documentation is required to determine reasonable accommodations. Personal Attendant Services are not provided by WVU Extension or 4-H, but the use of a personal attendant will be authorized to ensure the full participation of your child, if needed. A personal attendant may be necessary in some instances, such as to provide toileting needs, GI tube feeding, injectable medications, or if your child requires 1 to 1 behavioral supervision. Please contact Jill Hess for additional information. ****All accommodation requests should be made as far in advance as possible, as the accommodation process may take time to complete.**

Camp Health Care: All three Tri-County camps will have a Registered Nurse on site for the duration of the program to help provide health care and/or first aid.

Tri-County 4-H Camp is governed by WVU Extension Service and conducted under, and in compliance with, WVU Board of Governor's Rule 1.7 "Rule on Child Protection".

- **Older and Intermediate Campers:** The earlier you return your camp registration packet and fee, the earlier you will check in on camp registration day. Registration times are based on the date you return the form.
- **Everyone** who registers for camp will receive further information including their registration time, if applicable, via mail.
- **Camp Fee Refund:** No refund will be accepted after 9:00 a.m. the Monday one week prior to the opening day of the camp you will be attending.
- **Final registration day** will be when camp has reached capacity or **June 1.**
For participants ages 19-21, the final day is May 15 - no late registrations or walk-ins will be accepted.
- If your 4-H club is paying all or part of your camp fee, **they are to pay you directly.** Check with your 4-H leader or your Extension Agent if you need financial help to attend 4-H camp. **No one will be denied the opportunity to attend 4-H camp due to lack of funds.**

Consent & Permission to Participate at Tri-County 4-H Camp

I give permission for my child, _____ to participate in the **2019 Tri-County 4-H Camp** at Camp Frame. Activities involved in camp will include living in a cabin, sharing bathroom facilities with other campers, sleeping in bunk beds, swimming, nature hikes, shooting sports and outdoor cooking. Attending camp may lead to contact with individuals who are experienced and inexperienced in the above activities. I also understand that participation in this activity is strictly voluntary and is not a requirement for 4-H membership.

I am aware and have discussed with my child that:

1. Being in and around water, forests and participation in camp activities may cause clothing to become wet, dirty and beyond cleaning and/or repair;
2. Hiking on trails in the woods or fields may give rise to risk of injury arising from the surface or subsurface of the ground on which the hiking occurs;
3. Participation in sporting/recreational events may give rise to injury as a result of collisions with sports equipment or another person or sudden falls;
4. Other participants may act in a negligent manner which otherwise may result in harm to my child;
5. Swimming may lead to injury caused by slippery surfaces, contact with other swimmers and/or objects in the water;
6. While participating in educational classes and activities campers may risk injury from the very nature of learning new skills.

I recognize that the above outlined activities and potential resulting risk may cause injury, death, drowning or loss to participants or other persons in the immediate vicinity.

I understand that my child is not required to participate in these activities, but grant permission for him/her to do so, despite the possible risks. I recognize that by participating in this activity, as with any physical activity, my child may risk personal injury. I hereby attest and verify that I have been advised of the potential risks, that I have full knowledge of the risks involved in this activity, and that I assume any expenses that may be incurred in the event of an accident, illness or other incapacity, regardless of whether I have authorized such expenses.

RULES WHILE ATTENDING TRI COUNTY 4-H CAMP

1. Campers are not permitted to leave Camp Frame. Campers are expected to remain at camp all week and attend closing council circle unless an emergency arises. In such cases, permission from the Camp Director must be obtained. All campers must "sign in and out".
2. If a camper brings a vehicle to camp, they will be given parking instructions. All vehicles must be parked in designated areas, and are "off limits" while camp is in session. Teens that drive to camp must provide their car keys to the camp director for the duration of camp.
3. No visitors are allowed during the week at camp, unless approved in advance by the Camp Director.
4. Campers should not bring valuables to camp. The staff will not be responsible for any articles brought to Camp Frame.
5. Campers will be charged the cost for any physical facility damage they cause.
6. Do NOT move into dormitories before you check-in.
7. Cell phones, walkie-talkies, pagers, laptops and other wireless electronic devices for sending and/or receiving communication messages or images are not permitted at 4-H camp. Do NOT bring cell phones or cameras to camp.
8. No pets may be brought to 4-H Camp. Service animals must be on a leash.
9. Knives, firearms or explosives (fireworks, ammunition, etc.) will not be permitted on the camp property. No weapons are allowed.
10. All medicine - prescription and over the counter - must be given to the camp nurse at registration.
11. The use, consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages, liquor, beer, including non-intoxicating beer, and unlawful items, such as illegal non-prescription drugs, is not permitted at 4-H Camp.
12. Smoking, use or possession of tobacco products is not permitted at 4-H Camp.
13. Campers are expected to use the "Rule of Three" while attending 4-H Camp and to stay in approved areas while on the camp property.
14. Campers are not permitted in cabins unless adult camp staff are present. Girls' cabins are off limits to boys and Boys' cabins are off limits to girls.
15. Campers are not allowed out of the cabins after lights out.
16. Swimming is permitted at the pool only when a lifeguard is on duty. Archery/Rifle ranges are only used with proper qualified supervision.
17. Shoes, shirt, pants/shorts/skirt, must be worn at all times (except in the pool area). Shoes must be worn at all times OUTSIDE.

4-H Camp Harassment Policy: Tri-County 4-H Camp recognizes that a person's right to freedom from discrimination includes the opportunity to work and camp in an environment untainted by harassment. Offensive speech and conduct are wholly inappropriate and intolerable at Tri-County Camp. Harassment includes all unwelcome advances, written or verbal innuendoes, threats, insults, or disparaging remarks concerning a person's gender, national origin, race, creed, color, ancestry, age, sexual orientation, veteran status, physical or mental disability, or religious beliefs.

In addition to the above, sexual harassment is defined as unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and conduct of a sexual nature. Any camper or staff member who has a question or concern regarding any type of discrimination or harassment is encouraged to bring it to the attention of their Camp Director. Campers and Staff are to use the Rule of Three while attending Tri-County 4-H Camp.

4-H Camp Prank and Hazing Policy: Due to the fact that every camper has the right to a safe, secure and fun week at camp, no camper or staff will willfully prank or haze another person at camp. Items used for this purpose include, but are not limited to, water balloons, shaving cream, tape (etc.) If a camper is caught using these (for this purpose) they are subject to consideration for going home.

4-H Camp Dress Code Policy: Campers are expected to dress appropriately while at camp. Campers are not allowed to wear offensive clothing, clothing bearing offensive language or symbols, jewelry, or items that are disparaging to others.

4-H Camp Music Policy: All music played or used at Tri-County 4-H Camp will be "radio edit" only.

Camper Code of Conduct

The West Virginia 4-H program expects participants to behave in an acceptable manner and in accordance with the West Virginia 4-H Member Code of Conduct. Campers must agree to conduct themselves honorably while at camp and to accept the supervision and support of the Camp Director and staff while at camp. Campers are expected to be courteous, respectful and exhibit good sportsmanship while at 4-H Camp. Campers will follow the rules, policies and guidelines of Tri-County 4-H Camp. Campers will not abuse any camp participant (camper or staff) by physical or verbal means.

Member Consequences

Unacceptable behavior during 4-H Camp will result in consequences to the participant that may include:

1. Early release from Camp without refund.
2. Restitution or repayment of damages.
3. Denial of future participation in the 4-H Camping program at the local, state and national levels for one or more years.
4. Releasing the youth to the appropriate law enforcement agency and/or the proper authorities.

NOTE: Any conduct not specifically covered by this Code of Conduct, or the Policies and Rules stated above, but deemed inappropriate by those responsible for the 4-H Camp, will be viewed as a violation and appropriate action will be taken. If an infraction occurs, the Camp Director will provide appropriate communication to parents/guardians.
