Section H: Quilting; NON-baby, crib or lap size; Judged by method of piecing and/or style of decorations placed on top of fabric. Decorative patterns methods

- Class 46. Pieced: patchwork squares, crazy, any pieced pattern; finished
- Class 47. Pieced: unfinished
- Class 48. Embroidered design
- Quilting (only the quilting itself to be judged)
- Class 49. Hand quilted pattern

- Class 51. Machine quilted by exhibitor only

Other quilted items:

- Class 52. Wall hangings—hanging method must be provided/attached. NO bedding.
- Class 53. Pillow covers—hand guilted

- Class 55. Traditional wreath material, shape
- Class 56. Non-traditional material and/or shape

Section J: Creative Writing

- Class 57. Poetry—no word limit; any poetic pattern
- Class 58. Short Story—no word limit for showcase.
 (Note: CEOS state contest has a 500-word limit)
- Class 59. Other—news articles, letters to editor, etc.

Section K: Flowers

- Class 60. Dried materials-home grown, wild, or purchased
- Class 61. Fresh—home grown or wild only
- Class 62. Artificial materials
- Class 63. Plaques and other items created from plant or flower parts; includes seeds, nuts, etc.

Section L: Holiday Crafts (non-ceramic)

- Class 64. Christmas ornaments
- Class 65. Wall hangings—Christmas and other holidays/celebrations; must have hanging method attached or provided;

Section M: Pillows and Soft Sculptures

- Class 77. Produce—Home garden display; 3 varieties minimum, maximum 10 items overall. Exception: berries in small jar or small bunch of grapes/beans (still connected) may count as 1 item; MUST be in sturdy container which will NOT be judged.
- Class 78. Houseplants—Must have waterproof container (not judged) and must be owned at least 90 days before exhibiting.

Section P: Foods (any may be tasted by judges)

Class 111. Leftovers---A near duplicate of some ONE other item an exhibitor may have displayed elsewhere in CEOS area.

Class 113. Doesn't fit anywhere else

Class 114. Genealogy: No entry fee; No premium. Not judged. Bring all or part of your family tree/ancestry record. Books, charts, etc. May not occupy more than 2 feet of a table area. Wall displays size currently unlimited, unless lots of exhibits show up.
