Children living in West Virginia's rural and low-income communities that participate in our summer literacy enrichment program will improve their reading skills and increase enjoyment of and confidence in reading by the end of third grade, thereby decreasing the achievement gap with their peers. Better reading skills and increased confidence will lead to increased engagement and success in academics so that low-income youth have equal opportunities for post-secondary education and more career choices.

OUR HISTORY

Pilot Program

1994

Dr. Ruthellen Phillips and Dr. Belle Zars of WVU Extension saw a need for children in West Virginia to experience a safe summer learning environment that supplies healthy meals. The first Energy Express pilot program was implemented in two counties with 13 college student mentors and 85 children in 1994.



1997

Energy Express was featured as a model program on the U.S. Department of Education's Satellite Town Meeting on summer reading, and also recieved the 1997 Council of State Governments Innovation Award.


Energy Express received the Red Wagon Award from the WV's Promise Youth Alliance for creating a legacy of civic engagement in youth through our summer literacy programming.

LITERACY IMPACT



Bridging the summer education gap through literacy instruction

In 2023, only 44% of West Virginia students were proficient in reading, according to end of year assessments.

Children in low-income families have less exposure to books and academic enrichment experiences when they are not in school, and although they make up some of the achievement gap during the school year, they continue to fall behind each summer.

Children who are unable to read at grade level by third grade tend to lag behind their peers throughout the rest of theirschool years and are less likely to receive a high school diploma. Energy Express is dedicated to combating the summer slide by providing reading enrichment opportunities to children in grades first through sixth grade.

LEARNING STRUCTURE

The focus of the Energy Express learning model is the child and their connections to people and places.

During our six-week literacy program, AmeriCorps Mentors and volunteers guide children through enriching experiences that make reading meaningful in their lives. These experiences allow children to appreciate themselves, their individual experiences, and their place in the world.



INSTRUCTIONAL THEMES

The six weekly themes for Energy Express include Myself, Family, Friends, Homeplace, Community, and Making My World a Better Place, each focusing on personal growth, relationships, and contributing to a better community.

SMALL GROUP INSTRUCTION


Groups of eight children are placed in vertical-age groups spanning three grades.

We promote a noncompetitive environment, free from negative comparisons, ability grouping, and competitive recreation.


HEAR FROM OUR FAMILIES

Families involved with Energy Express find their children are more engaged in reading and literacy instruction.

By involving families in literacy education, Energy Express helps develop a culture of reading at home. In 2024, families listed literacy assistance as the most valued benefit of Energy Express. Through mentorship and intentional peer involvement, parents also reported that their children showed enhanced social skills and confidence.








Parents reported their children's independent reading increased from **2.8 days per week** before the program to **4.6 days per week** after completing the program.

AMERICORPS PROGRAM

Nationally recognized service initiative for college students

Our program sets the standard for service in West Virginia by providing in-depth training for AmeriCorps members to learn to create a fulfilling learning environment for each child in Energy Express. By serving as mentors and community coordinators, AmeriCorps members gain valuable life and professional skills while making a difference.

264 AMERICORPS MEMBERS

enrolled in 41 different colleges in Fall 2024.

48 COMMUNITY PROJECTS

organized by AmeriCorps members for various service initiatives.

\$399,837 TOTAL

in educational awards provided to mentors to cover college tuition and fees.

44 AMERICORPS MEMBERS

served as community coordinators, connecting children to local mentors.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

Each member receives 300 service hours per term.

Two AmeriCorps terms equates to a free semester at West Virginia state institutions.

An education award of \$1,459.26 toward university tuition and fees.

COMMUNITY NUTRITION

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Without meeting basic developmental needs, children lack the tools to be successful in learning.

Energy Express fuels our literacy program by supplying each child with adequate nutrition to create a healthy learning environment. The two meals served at Energy Express help children avoid summer nutritional loss, while increasing their literacy success. During summer 2024, each child received **60 nourishing meals.**

FAMILY STYLE MEALS



Our meals are served in a family-style format, where children learn to share and socialize with others. AmeriCorps Mentor's serve as role models, while encouraging children to have healthy eating habits.
